

Q&A for G1/G2 (NANT)

No.	Question	Answer
1	What is SBB?	SBB stands for Subject Based Banding, where some students qualify to take subjects at a more demanding level, eg G2 or G3 level.
2	What is ECG?	It stands for Education and Career Guidance. Ms Aries Lim is our Education and Career Guidance (ECG) officer who is able to offer valuable advice to our students on their educational pathway.
3	What is the eligibility criteria for lateral transfer from 2G2 to 3G3 ?	The student must attain a minimum 70% score for all subjects and be deemed able to cope well academically. The school will base the decision on input from the relevant academic Heads of Department.
4	What is the minimum score in Chinese Language in order to qualify for the Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) ?	There is no criteria for the score in Chinese Language.
5	My nephew was from Sec 3 NA stream and the school used to offer 7 subjects including AM and POA. The school currently only offers 6 subjects to NA/G2. Any possibility to offer 7 subjects to this stream ?	The school has been offering 6 subjects at NA / G2 level for a few years to streamline the subject combinations to the admission criteria to institutes of higher learning. We have observed that students can cope better with the demand of these subjects.
6	For G2 Elective/SBB subjects, what will be the subject combinations when students move on to Secondary 5 ?	The subjects offered in Secondary 5 will be a progression from the N(A)-level subjects that the student had taken in Secondary 4.
7	What is the minimum score for English and Math to enrol for Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) ?	The minimum scores are B3 for English (NA) and Mathematics (NA).
